## Long Term English Learner (LTEL) Data

Monterey County has the second largest percentage of English learners in the state, according to data released for the 2015-2016 school year (State of California, 2016). The county's school districts are organized by district configuration, but caution should be used not to compare districts to each other. Districts listed as small school districts in Monterey County are elementary districts with fewer than 901 students enrolled, unified districts with fewer than 1501 students, or high school districts with fewer than 301 students. In such districts, certain measures such as percentage may be misleading and must be interpreted in the context of the school or schools that are configured. Comparison between districts is further complicated by the fact that, given the inclusion of duration in LTEL and at-risk definitions, districts with higher grades tend to have higher percentages of LTELs. Finally, in addition to the minimum criteria required by the State of California, each district may determine additional criteria for reclassification of English learners. Rather than for comparison, these data are useful for building awareness, identifying programmatic areas for improvement, informing instruction, and accounting for the growth or decline of each group.
